Problem Solving









A key part of our program is learning how to solve problems. Problem solving involves building communication skills, self-expression, negotiation, critical thinking, and empathy and so much more, this process takes time and support!

An important part of this process is to identify what the problem is and whose problem it is. We find that times children say, "so and so did... fill in the blank..." and look to the teachers to solve it for them, which does not teach this important skill. We are empowering the

children to stick up and speak up for themselves with support from the teachers. We support them by giving guidelines, support, and a script. Here is a simple example of how we build the skill of problem solving, first each person involved in the conflict gets a chance to talk and share their side of the story. The next step is to ask what the other person needs. For example: a child knocks down a building built by a friend. The child stops and expresses what happened, then either finds out it was an accident, or the child asks them to help rebuild it. Some

of the "problems" turn out to be accidents. We have now included encouraging children to say, "sorry that was an accident, how can I help fix it?" before it becomes a bigger problem. Our goal is to help the children learn how to solve problems and communicate their needs. Again, this takes tons of practice.

One critical point we are focusing on is teaching the children to say, "I need help to solve a problem." Especially when a friend may not be listening.

Problems are a part of everyday life. We feel are inspired to support learning this important life skill and empower children.

Upcoming family workday –Oct. 28
